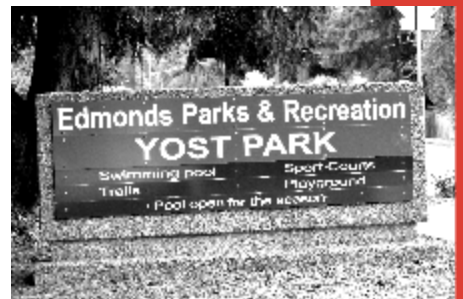


Edmonds police will face \$3.6M in additional cuts, reducing our force to .84 officers per 1000 residents (national average is 2.4/1,000.)
